BEGINNING/INTERMEDIATE SKILLS FOR POTTERS

Instructor: Devin Brown Tuesdays, 5-8pm Tuition: \$285 (Members: \$270)

This class teaches the basics of wheel throwing. Concentrating on weekly projects, the first half will focus on basic techniques of centering and throwing for beginners. As students progress, there will be demonstrations in thrown and altered combining techniques, as well as decorative glaze techniques to enhance your surfaces. No experience necessary.

START AT THE BEGINNING: HANDBUILDING

Instructor: Victoria Smith Saturdays: 9:30am-12:30pm Tuition: \$285 (Members: \$270)

Beginner/Intermediate Handbuilding. The class will cover and review hand building skills—pinch, coil and slab. There will be a demonstration for each project assigned. Each student is encouraged to create an original project upon approval. Materials list available upon registration.



BEGINNERS AND BEYOND FOR POTTERS

Instructor: Angela Humes Fridays, 11am-3pm Tuition: \$350 (Members: \$335)

This class teaches the basics and more advanced techniques of wheel throwing. Learn how to hone your skills through demos, one on one instruction, and guidance from the instructor. Demonstrations will focus on throwing on the wheel and trimming. Your instructor will guide you toward your own personal goals in clay.

CLAY OPEN STUDIO

DEVELOPING SKILLS IN CLAY

Instructor: Ellen Pine Litwin Wednesdays, 6:30-9:30pm Tuition: \$285 (Members: \$270)

Beginners will be introduced to basic hand building and wheel skills. More advanced students will focus on further developing their skills and making more complex forms. Students will have the opportunity to set individual goals with the help of the instructor. Learning about the glazing and firing process is included.

INTERMEDIATE WHEEL THROWING

Instructor: Angela Humes Thursdays, 5-8pm Tuition: \$285 (Members: \$270)

This class teaches wheel throwing to intermediate level students who want to learn how to finesse their work. We will have demonstrations and projects designed by the instructor to hone your individual talent. The instructor will guide you toward your personal goals in clay.

IMPROVING YOUR SKILLS IN CLAY

Instructor: Ellen Pine Litwin Thursdays, 10am-1pm Tuition: \$285 (Members: \$270)

Improve your skills by learning the "Details of Craftsmanship" that make your work more personal and more finished. We will focus primarily on throwing skills. Exercises will be given to improve throwing technique. A variety of lids, handles, and spouts will also be demonstrated. More advanced students will have the opportunity to set individual goals with the help of the instructor. We will also learn more about the glazing and firing process.





ADVANCED HANDBUILDING IN EARTHENWARE CLAY

Instructor: Barbara Hanselman Tuesdays, 10:30am-1:30pm Tuition: \$285 (Members: \$270)

This adventure includes exploring basic pinch, coil and slab handbuilding then moves onto creating forms with templates. We'll not only learn how to form pots using the pinch-strip method, but we'll also employ templates and press molds to make awesome cups, vases & trays. By creating our own patterns and textures on the clay surface, it will be a breeze to build pieces which are truly our own. Colorful surface enhancements, transfers and specialty low fire glazes are also an integral part of this experience. CLAY...I love where it takes me!

SURFACE DECORATION AND MORE

Instructor: Angela Humes Wednesdays, 12-4pm Tuition: \$350 (Members: \$335)

This class will focus on decorating the form with underglazes, glazes, mason stains, and carving techniques. The instructor will work alongside you, giving tutorials and showing her own unique processes like watercolor underglazing, sgraffito, and carving.



DRAWING

Instructor: Heather Diacont Rinehart Tuesdays, 6:30-8:30pm Tuition: \$225 (Members: \$210)

Drawing is the fundamental skill that will transform your painting or crafting skills. It is essential to making great art. Whether you've been drawing for a while, or you're an absolute beginner, this class will help you improve. You will learn how to translate what you see and bring it to life on the page. You will learn tips, techniques and materials that will help you take your drawings to a professional level.

FIGURE DRAWING OPEN STUDIO

Monitor: Heather Diacont Rinehart Saturdays, 10am-1pm Tuition: \$15 drop in fee

This is an opportunity to work from a nude model and improve your drawing skills. Each session will start with 2-3-minute poses and extend to 20 minutes. This is a monitored class, but instruction will be available upon request.



PAINTING: A CREATIVE APPROACH

Instructor: Stephen Kennedy Tuesdays, 10am-2pm Tuition: \$320 (Members: \$305)

This class includes demonstration and instruction in composition, color theory, and painting techniques using oil, acrylic, and charcoal. Personal growth and expression are emphasized in critiques. New students should bring the medium of their choice or vine charcoal and an 18"x24" charcoal pad for the first class.

DRAWING IN CHARCOAL

Instructor: Stephen Kennedy Wednesdays, 6:30-9:30pm Tuition: \$275 (Members: \$260)

Charcoal is one of the oldest, most versatile, and least expensive drawing mediums. This course will emphasize tonal value, perspective, and composition and will include demos, discussions, and critiques. The opportunity to progress your drawing to painting is available. Students will work from a live model for three of the sessions.


INDEPENDENT STUDY IN PAINTING AND DRAWING

PAINTING WITH THE MIND'S EYE

Instructor: Heather Diacont Rinehart Mondays, 1-4pm Tuition: \$265 (Members: \$250)

A painting class for those interested in amplifying their mind's eye and utilizing personal imagery in their paintings. Using examples from art history, guided exercises, and demonstration. participants will hone techniques that will enhance the imaginative aspects of their work, combining the craftsmanship of classical painting with personal expression. All painting and drawing mediums are welcome. Objectives: This class aims to give artists greater access to their imagination, awareness of symbology, and the techniques to bring their thoughts to the canvas. Materials: Medium of choice.

WATERCOLOR PAINTING

Instructor: Robby Schlesinger Thursdays, 6:30-8:30pm Tuition: \$225 (Members: \$210)

Students get step-by-step instruction in the fundamentals of watercolor painting. This course teaches classical watercolor techniques which can be adapted to any subject. You will master the basic techniques, build confidence, and most importantly-enjoy the process. You will get individual guidance and support in a cooperative and mutually helpful environment, Classes consist of live demos, structured exercises, and project paintings that apply each technique. NEW! WATERCOLOR STILL LIFES: TRANSFORMING OBSERVATION INTO ART

Instructor: Nicole Patrice Dul, M.F.A. Tuesdays, 10am-12N Tuition: \$225 (Member \$210)

This class focuses on creating still-life images with watercolor, depicting real objects like household items, food, plants. and flowers to add meaning and vitality to watercolors. The class introduces watercolor techniques specifically for still-life art, ending with sketches and painting. Focus areas include composition. observation, and color mixing for realism, using layering, washes, and techniques like wet-on-wet and dry for soft edges, sharp details, We'll depict shadows and highlights for form. Near the end. students will have a special opportunity to combine monotype printing with watercolor to produce unique prints on our printing press, merging spontaneity with creativity. All skill levels are welcome. See website for materials list.

NON-TOXIC PRINTMAKING

Instructor: Kate VanVliet Thursdays, 10am-2pm Tuition: \$320 (Members: \$305)

Non-Toxic Printmaking serves as a supporter of your individual journey through printmaking, Curriculum is crafted by students' interests with a focus on individual attention to complete your projects. This class includes demonstrations. critiques and instruction in basic printmaking media; collagraphs. monoprints, drypoint intaglio, relief printing, Silkscreen is welcome with prior experience and understanding that darkroom access is not provided. New innovations in safe. non-toxic printmaking practices are covered. Please come to class. with any printmaking supplies you have, including printmaking paper, with additional materials list discussed the first day of class. All levels welcome.

INTAGLIO IN DEPTH

Instructor: Kate VanVliet Mondays 10am-2pm Tuition: \$320 (Members: \$305)

Intaglio in Depth is a deep dive into the wonderful world of etching! Students will learn to prepare copper plates for etching with ferric chloride. Safety procedures, studio chemistry, and solvent compatibility will be covered in depth. We will explore methods of etched markmaking beyond the drawn line

including soft ground etching of found matter, spray paint aquatint with positive and negative resists, and more. Handwork techniques include scraping/burnishing, using manual and electric engraving/ drypoint tools. Students will produce engaging prints that prompt the question, "how did they do that?" and learn how to create identical and variable editions through paper preparation and printing techniques. Color printing via multi-plate registration, chine collé, à la poupée, hand-coloring and viscosity rolls will be explored. Some shared materials and tools are provided. Closed-toed shoes are required in the etching lab.

Materials list provided by instructor at registration. Copper plates can be purchased from the instructor at cost or should be brought to the first day of class.



NEW! INCREDIBLE **IMPRESSIONS: EXPLORING PRINTMAKING TECHNIQUES**

Instructor: Nicole Patrice Dul, M.F.A. Thursdays, 6:30 PM-9 PM Tuition: \$245 (Members \$230)

Explore the fascinating world of printmaking techniques and discover how these remarkable impressions can bring art to life! Whether you're a beginner or experienced, this printmaking class provides an engaging way to explore this versatile art form covering methods like relief printing (linocut, woodcut). intaglio (drypoint, etching), collagraph, monotype, and screen printing. The course teaches preparing the matrix, inking, printing, and best practices for tool prep and cleaning, Emphasizing design principles and creative problem-solving, the class guides project development and experimentation with composition and image transfer. Students will also explore examples from traditional printmaking history and see how it has influenced contemporary art. See website for materials list.



NEW! EXPERIMENTAL PRINTMAKING: A **CREATIVE JOURNEY**

Instructor: Nicole Patrice Dul, M.F.A. Wednesdays, 10:30 AM-1:30 PM Tuition: \$265 (Members: \$250)

In experimental printmaking, artists push the boundaries of traditional techniques by employing unconventional methods, materials. and processes. This challenges established norms and encourages innovation to produce distinctive print works. The course investigates the relationship between art. technology, and contemporary visual arts, focusing on the unique qualities of each print rather than its reproducibility. Participants will experiment with blending traditional and digital methods, creating unique prints by combining photographic elements with techniques like screen printing, relief, intaglio, pronto plate, or paper lithography, printing on unconventional surfaces, and collaging their work. NEW! EXPLORING COLOR MIXING WITH RED, YELLOW & BLUE DYES

Fall 4-Week Mini Session—Adult & Teen (16+)

Instructor: Megan Raab Greenholt

Saturdays: 10am-1pm, October 4, 11, 18, 25

Tuition: \$175 (Member: \$160)

Join us for a four-part journey into the art of natural dyeing using the three primary colors—Red (Cochineal), Yellow (Goldenrod), Blue (Iron Indigo Vat)—to unlock a full spectrum of hues through thoughtful color mixing and layering. In this hands-on mini-series, you'll Learn how to prepare fabric using a mordant to ensure vibrant, lasting color. Explore immersion dyeing to build your color foundation. Experiment with resist dyeing techniques, including traditional Shibori and Soy Milk Paste, to create striking patterns. Overdve with indigo, to transform your work with deep blues. By the end of the series, you'll take home a hand-dyed silk scarf of your own design and 1.5 yards of naturally dyed fabric, ready to be turned into your own unique textile piece. Whether you're new to natural dyeing or looking to deepen your practice, this workshop will equip you with foundational techniques and creative inspiration. Discover the vibrant world of natural dves through an immersive series focused on three distinct techniques using cotton, silk, and paper, You will learn Botanical Printing/Bundle Dyeing (Class 1), Hapa-Zome: Flower Pounding (Class 2), Iron Indigo Vat & Shibori Resist (Class 3), Planning Your Natural Dye Garden (Final Class). METALS & MORE

JEWELRY MAKING

Instructor: Marthe Roberts/Shea Tuesdays, 6:30-9:30pm or Thursdays, 10am-1pm Tuition: \$270 (Members: \$255)

See what goes into the creative process of making jewelry. We'll start by practicing basic skills to make creative and interesting shapes from base metal. Students will learn how to use some of the different tools available as well as how to use an acetylene torch to solder silver elements together to create jewelry. Additional skills include sawing, filing and simple stone setting. Once students are comfortable with these techniques they can move on to our first project of a ring with a center stone. With instructor demonstration



and supervision, more experienced students can benefit from additional instruction that can help them advance to more involved pieces.

GOLD LUSTER WORKSHOP

Gold luster is an overglaze decoration applied on top of a fully fired, glazed ceramic piece. The piece can be low to high fired clay. This process requires a third firing that sets the luster on top of the glaze adding sophistication and grace to your artfully design pieces. In this seminar, you will be applying gold or white gold luster to your glazed pieces with instruction and demonstrations. All decoration will take place outside. Gold luster and paint brushes and gloves will be provided. Please bring no more than 5 glazed pieces. Size limit: no larger than 8"x8".

NEW! FIBER ARTS WORKSHOP: MX FIBER REACTIVE DYE PRINTING

Instructor: Megan Raab Greenholt 10am-12pm OR 2pm-4pm, Saturday, January 10 (choose 1 time slot) Tuition: \$65

Join Megan Raab Greenholt for a hands-on discussion and demonstration exploring the basics of printing with dye on fabric. In this engaging workshop, you'll learn the fundamentals of monotype screen printing using MX Fiber Reactive dye pastes, with a focus on breakdown printing—a unique, deconstructive method of surface design transferred onto fabric. Through repeated applications, you'll build a vibrant, one-of-a-kind textile artwork to take home. All materials are included to create your own breakdown print on cotton.

NEW! PRINTMAKING WORKSHOP SERIES

Instructor Nicole Patrice Dul, M.F.A., will offer a workshop every session introducing participants to the broad spectrum of non-toxic printmaking techniques. Classes are beginner-friendly and provide hands-on experience with various processes for creative exploration. The key is to blend the traditional and contemporary, the technical and the expressive, to unlock the full potential of printmaking.

GELATIN ARTS MINI JOURNALS

Instructor: Nicole Patrice Dul, M.F.A. Fall Session: 4 Fridays, Sept 26, Oct 3, 10 & 17, 10:30am-1:30pm Tuition: \$165 (Member: \$155)

Unleash your creativity while exploring gel plate printing, a fun and unique monoprinting method that produces beautiful, one-of-a-kind prints on a flexible gelatin plate. This technique involves stenciling, stamping, masking, layering, and mark-making to add color, texture, and design to paper. You will also learn



how to assemble your artwork into charming mini journals and explosion books. The workshop covers a range of techniques, from beginner to advanced gel plate printing, as well as ideas for transforming your prints into projects. A variety of supplies, such as printmaking papers, newsprint, gel plates, mediums, inks, etc. are provided. A materials fee of \$20 is payable to the instructor on the first day. No prior printmaking experience necessary.
